As we move forward into November, we want to share some major milestones achieved in Phase 1. Our four cranes are now fully erected and in action, with notable progress on Block C near Parkhurst Road. The site is buzzing with activity as we advance towards our goals.

We're also continuing to promote our apprenticeship programme. We're particularly keen on encouraging more women to enter the sector, where they remain underrepresented. This is a unique opportunity to work locally and help shape the future of our community.

Work Experience Week leads to employment

Through our collaboration with the OHOB Academy, we held a work experience week, offering participants a firsthand look at various roles on a construction site. As a result, one resident started this week as a trainee site supervisor. Additionally, Islington delivered their E3 course on green careers, further supporting our mission to develop skills for a sustainable future.

We've also delivered two Level 2 Retrofit courses in October. Participants not only gained valuable knowledge but also earned a Level 1 in Health and Safety and received training for the CSCS card test. The CSCS card is an essential requirement to work on construction sites

- Block D is at ground floor and starting level
- Block E2 is at ground floor.
- Roadway formed between D3 & E1.

Upcoming Work

- Drainage has commenced along the road from gate 3 to block E.
- Block C frame level 2 & 3.
- Block D frame level 2.
- Roadway to gate 3.
- Block E ground slab & 1st level Slab.
