Cllr Potts Visits Holloway Park

We were delighted to welcome Cllr Potts to Holloway Park as part of Islington Council's Making it Happen campaign, which showcases projects that are delivering real benefits for local communities.

During the visit, Cllr Potts learned more about the collaborative work between London Square, Peabody and Islington Council, including apprenticeships, employment support, the Women in Construction programme and the Green Skills Hub.

The visit also included a tour of the future Women's Building, a dedicated multi-functional community and support space that will form part of the wider Holloway Park development. Discussions focused on creating inclusive opportunities for local residents through skills development, training and employment pathways.

Kundakala Digital Photography Workshop

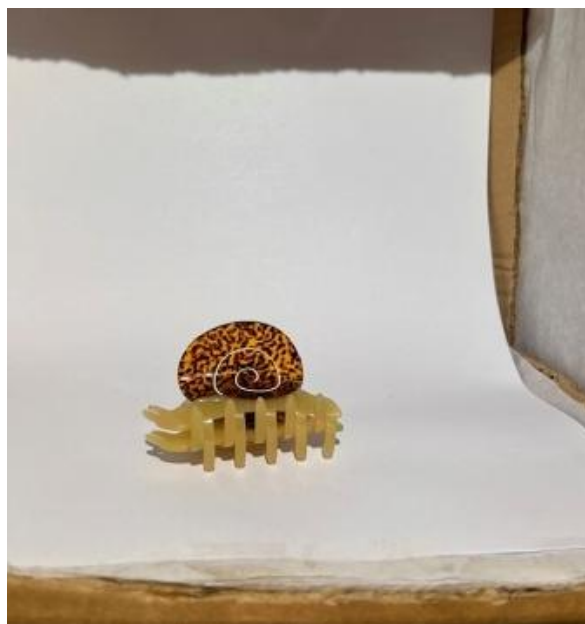
As part of our ongoing partnership with Kundakala, a digital photography workshop for learners on the Alterations & Upcycle programme was delivered at the Green Skills Hub here at Holloway Park.

The workshop was designed to help participants develop practical skills to better promote and sell their handmade products online. During the session, learners discovered how to create a simple photography lightbox using everyday household materials and explored techniques for taking high-quality product photographs using their smartphones. The group also discussed social media, online selling platforms, pricing strategies and the importance of valuing their skills and time when starting a business.

The workshop was well received, with participants leaving feeling inspired, more confident and equipped with practical knowledge they can apply to their future enterprises.
